## **P.C.A.H.A. 2006-2007 MEMORANDUM #8**

**SUBJECT:** **Shortened Third Period in PCAHA Playoff Games.**

One of the major sources of disputes in playoff games is the time allocated to the third period. Many team officials believe that the third period may not be shortened in a playoff game. In fact, almost all playoff games are played under Section G(7)-Note (b), which states:

Prior to the third period, if the referee feels there is not sufficient time to play the period as listed, he/she will notify both teams that it is necessary to shorten the period by a specific number of stop-time minutes. This must be noted on the game report by the referee. The revised playing time shall be shown on the clock at the commencement of the third period.

Note (b) shall apply to all league and playoff games with the exception of the following:

- (i) Games in the Minor "A" and "B" Conference or playoff grouping Championship "Final 4" (hosted) Round-Robin series [Section N(10)(e)].<sup>1</sup>
- (ii) Games in the Minor "A" and "B" Conference or playoff grouping Championship Final four-point playoff series (if any) [Section N(11)(f)]<sup>2</sup>
- (iii) Tiebreaker Games under Section N(13).<sup>3</sup>
- (iv) Games designated by the Executive Committee as requiring three full periods.

A complete third period for the purpose of the above situations means a 15-minute stop time period if the icetime is a 1-hour or 1¼-hour icetime, and a 20-minute stop time period if the icetime is a 1½-hour or 1¾-hour or longer icetime.

The following situations do not require a full third period and will follow G(7)-Note (b) if there is insufficient icetime to complete a full third period:

1. All "A" or "B" round-robin series except the Playoff Championship "Final 4" hosted round-robin series, as mentioned above.
2. All "A" and "B" Presidents Series.
3. All Female round-robin playoff series.
4. All "C" round-robin playoff series.
5. The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd games in preliminary round Four Point Series.
6. Single Game Elimination Series Format #2.

In games in which the third period may be shortened, the referee is required to make his or her decision prior to the start of the third period. Once the third period has started the referee can no longer modify the period time. Section G(7)-Note (d) states, "The referee must

attempt to complete the game in its entirety, unless advised by the arena ice engineer that the icetime has expired.”

**Running time may not be used under any circumstances.**

Regardless of the format used, the first and second periods may not be shortened.

It is advisable for the respective Playoff Supervisor to communicate with the participating teams prior to the start of a playoff round to ensure all teams are aware of the game format being used for each game.
